**CENTRAL GAUTENG GOLF UNION**

**JUNIOR BETTERBALL LEAGUE CONDITIONS**

**2026 SEASON**

**1. Composition**

- 1.1 The league will be divided into 4 (four) divisions and teams will play each other on a home or away basis.
- 1.2 Clubs may be restricted to enter a maximum amount of teams based on availability or otherwise approved by the CGGU.
- 1.3 All new entrants shall commence in the lowest Division.
- 1.4 The CGGU retains the right to adjust the number of teams in the lowest Division. This may result in fewer or more games being played during the season depending on the final numbers. The bottom division is to be considered as a feeder division in order to encourage league participation.

**2. Date of Play**

- 2.1 All matches must be played on the date as published on the fixture list **and no extensions will be permitted**. Clubs may arrange with their opponents to play the match prior to the scheduled date but not a later date. **The clubs must notify the union if there has been any date changes. The only exception to this is the last match of the season which must be played on the scheduled date and may not be moved earlier.** Any match not completed on the scheduled date, will be logged as completed with neither team being allocated any points.
- 2.2 Fixtures should normally be scheduled on Sundays in the afternoon field, preferably near the front of the field (particularly in winter months). Agreement may be reached to play Sunday morning games, or on Saturdays. **Unless agreed via written communication and agreed upon by both clubs it will be assumed that the tee times will start at 11:30 am. Clubs are responsible for recording the correct tee time on the Scorecapture Online system.**

**3. Club Responsibilities**

- 3.1 The host club should set the course up so that matches are played off the tees that the overall length must not exceed the total length as per the club rating distance on the scorecard. Players may select which set of tees they would like to play from and adjust their handicap accordingly.

### GOLF

- 3.2 A maximum of 3 (three) temporary greens may be used by the home club, failing which, an alternative venue must be arranged for the fixture or the “home” team must also play at the away venue as per clause 3.3.
- 3.3 In the event of a home course being deemed unplayable, the club’s home side may either play at the away venue or at a neutral venue. In either case the original home team, whose course is unplayable, will be responsible for the full costs of that fixture which includes green fees, halfway house and drinks for both their team and the opposition team. Should the original home club not be prepared to pay the full costs, they will forfeit the points of the 4 games.
- 3.4 Clubs are responsible for accurately uploading their correct team players on the Scorecapture Online System. The uploading of team names can be done at any stage before the fixture, but there will be a cut-off at 23:59 the day before the scheduled date. This is to allow the system to correctly calculate handicaps on the date of play. Clubs may elect to “hide” their team from the opposing team, but these will become visible 30 mins before the club’s recorded first tee time.
- 3.5 Should a player need to be replaced on the date of play, this must be done prior to the 30 minutes reveal time.
- 3.6 Should a club not upload their team by the cut-off time the following penalties will be imposed:  
**1 GAME point penalty for each offence.**

## 4. Details of play

- 4.1 Play is to be conducted in accordance with the rules of golf as approved by The R&A Rules of Golf and these League Conditions which are deemed to be the Terms of the Competition for this league.
- 4.2 All matches are to be played on a four-ball match play format over 18 holes.
- 4.3 **The maximum handicap for Junior League is 36.0 Handicap Index.** All players must reduce their Course Handicap to **90% of their handicap**. Please refer to the handicap table on the website for the correct calculated handicaps. Once this **90% adjustment** is made the lowest handicap will be reduced to scratch and the rest of the players in the match will reduce their adjusted handicaps by that amount.
- 4.4 The matches to be played in Combined Handicap Index order with the lowest combined Course Handicap Indexes of each match playing as pairing 1 (first off) and highest combined Course Handicap Indexes playing as pairing 3 (last off)
- 4.5 The Scorecapture System has the lowest handicap players listed as Player 5 & 6, followed by 3 & 4 and the highest handicap players as Players 1 & 2.

- 4.6 Should a club not be able to field a full team, they can decide which position they would like the single player to play in, provided this is done before the teams are released to each other. The remaining two pairs must, however, still play in the Combined Handicap Order. The single player may play in any position on their Playing Handicap for the day.
- 4.7 Should a player not arrive on time for their game, the game will proceed in their absence and will be played according to the calculated handicaps as uploaded on the system. This includes if the absent player is the lowest handicap as well. The absent player may join the game at any time before its conclusion.
- 4.8 The Scorecapture system will automatically open a round for each player for a CGGU League fixture.
- 4.9 Players who finish a competition match play round, before the full 18 holes have been played, must enter their **hole-by-hole gross scores for the completed holes in the HNA system**, and then select the incomplete round option on the HNA system. The system will then use the WHS expected score algorithm, to complete the 18 holes gross score for the player. **Players who go on to complete the round after the match has ended, should not enter their stroke play scores for the remaining holes, because the combination of a competition match play and social stroke play score, is not an acceptable score.**
- 4.10 The Scorecapture Online System will automatically calculate handicaps the morning of the scheduled round. Teams who arrange to play a fixture prior to the scheduled date must notify the Union to ensure the correct calculation of handicaps.  
**It is still the player's responsibility to ensure that they are playing off the correct handicap. Players should check their current handicap on the HNA system prior to commencing play.**
- 4.11 Each team shall comprise of 6 players, boys or girls.
- 4.12 **Girls must play using the men's pars and strokes.**
- 4.13 A team may elect to play its home games at a neutral venue or at the away venue provided that this is agreed to by both clubs concerned. The original home team, that requested the venue change, must cover the full costs for both their team and opposition team as per clause 3.3. Should teams not agree to play as above, they will then play as per the league schedule or alternatively the original home team will forfeit the points of the 4 games.
- 4.14 Security concerns: The away Club is to address their concern with the home/host venue that has a security or perceived security problem. Should the issue not be mutually resolved then the match in question is to be played at a neutral venue.
- 4.15 Matches are subject to the home club's local rules. The home club's manager is responsible for explaining the local rules to the opposition as well as advising on the proper etiquette.

4.16 Order of play will be visiting team first followed by the home team.

### 5. Conditions of play

- 5.1 Clubs in most cases should have no placing for Junior League. Only if there is an abnormal condition on the course will this be permitted.
- 5.2 All matches for a specific fixture must start on the same tee. Where a club has more than one team at home, that team may use a different starting tee.
- 5.3 No player or his caddie may caddie for any other member of another match during the same round.
- 5.4 Only local club caddies may be used should the host club have them. No parents or friends are permitted to caddy. Penalty for breach of this will be: 1st offence – warning, 2nd offence – loss of hole, 3rd offence disqualification.
- 5.5 The use of golf carts is prohibited and players are required to walk at all times during the match.
- 5.6 Playing of music during league matches. Players may not play music during league matches. **Model Local Rule G-8.** For all CGGU League matches, Rule 4.3a(4) is modified in this way:  
**During a round, a player must not listen to content of any nature on any audio device.**

First offence – warning, second offence – general penalty (loss of hole), third offence – disqualification.

### 6. Participants

- 6.1 The league is open to all affiliated amateur golfers who are under 19 years of age on the tee and whose club is a member of the Central Gauteng Golf Union
- 6.2 A player must be officially handicapped at the Club they are representing
- 6.3 Participants may not compete for more than one Club in the Season.
- 6.4 A player may not play for more than one team in the same round.
- 6.5 Where a club has two teams in separate divisions, no more than 50% of one team may play for the other division's team.
- 6.6 In order to facilitate and promote Junior Golf, a player may play Junior League as well as any of the other Leagues available in the CGGU provided they meet the criteria.

- 6.7 Eligibility Requirements for Players with Disabilities to use Rule 25. Any registered disabled golfer through SADGA (South African Disabled Golf Association) is permitted to participate in CGGU Leagues. It is a player's category of disability and eligibility that determine whether they can use specific modified Rules in Rule 25.

**In the event of clause 6 being breached, the club shall be deemed to have lost every individual match in which the defaulting player participated in breach of either of those clauses. There is no time limit on applying this penalty.**

## 7. Weather

- 7.1 If the course is open at the start of the matches, the matches must be played in accordance with Clause 5 – Conditions of Play.
- 7.2 If the course is deemed unplayable prior to the start of the matches and called off by the Club's Duty Officials, the result will be deemed a half (i.e. 4 GAMES ALL) and will not be rescheduled (See 2.2)
- 7.3 If a match has started and is subsequently called off due to weather conditions, the results will be determined as follows:
- 7.3.1 If any match has not completed nine holes, that match will be declared a half.
  - 7.3.2 The result of matches, where more than nine holes have been completed, will be determined by the state of the match when play is discontinued.

**Note 1:** The Club Official (Club Manager, Duty Club Manager or Golf Director) of the Club will determine if weather conditions prevent or cause delay, abandonment or resumption of play. Once any of the aforementioned determinations are made, the players must be advised accordingly. Should the decision be to prevent or abandon play, the rules as defined in clauses 7.2 and 7.3 must be used to determine the results of the day.

**Note 2:** A Club that has its course closed due to weather/ playability in the days prior to a fixture and that remains closed on the day of the fixture MUST advise the visiting Club or its team of such closure in good time, to avoid unnecessary travel for those visiting players. All reasonable effort must be made to undertake this courtesy. Failure to advise the visiting team of such closure, will result in the match being awarded to the VISITING TEAM.

**Note 3:** Players are expected to remain at the home Club until such time as the Club Official calls off play for the day.

### 8. Results

- 8.1 The Scorecapture Online result sheet must be completed and verified by both team captains and submitted on the date of play. Details on how to submit via the Scorecapture Online process is available in the Scorecapture League Manual.
- 8.2 Should a club not submit and verify their scores by the end of the day of the date of the match being played the following penalty will be imposed:  
**1 GAME point penalty for each offence.**

### 9. Scoring

- 9.1 The overall result will be achieved by awarding one point for each game won and a half point for a halved game. In the event of a match being all square after 18 holes the match will be declared a half.
- 9.2 Two points will be awarded for to the winning team in every match. In the event of a half, one point will awarded to each team.
- 9.3 In the event of a team not arriving for a fixture, their opponents will be awarded the two log points and 2.5 game points. The defaulting team will not receive any game points.
- 9.4 Should a team default by not playing a fixture during the season, a written request must be submitted to the CGGU Executive detailing the reason for this. Should the CGGU Executive feel that the team defaulting may in some way affect the outcome of that division, additional penalties or sanctions may be imposed on that team at the CGGU Executive's discretion.

### 10. Withdrawals

- 10.1 Should a team withdraw during the season the results of the matches played by the team will be null and void and logs will be adjusted accordingly. The remaining matches will be cancelled. That team will then remain on the log with zero points.
- 10.2 Should a team withdraw during the season (the season starts once the schedule has been published), a written request must be submitted to the CGGU Executive detailing the reason for this. Should the CGGU Executive feel that the team withdrawing may in some way affect the outcome of that division, additional penalties or sanctions may be imposed on that team at the CGGU Executive's discretion.

### **11. Ties in the log**

11.1 Should two or more teams have the same points in the log standings, the following will apply in order of preference to determine the winning team:

11.1.1 The team with the most Games Points, thereafter;

11.1.2 The result between the two tied teams, thereafter;

11.1.3 The team with the most halved matches;

11.1.4 If none of the above result in an outcome the tie will be determined by the flip of a coin.

### **12. Promotion and relegation**

12.1 At the conclusion of the league season, the top 2 (two) teams in each division will be promoted to the next division. The bottom 2 (two) teams in each division will be relegated to the next division down. By default there is no promotion in the top division and no relegation in the bottom division.

### **13. General Information**

13.1 An entry fee determined by the CGGU will be due per team at the start of each season.

13.2 Visiting players must adhere to the home club's dress regulations for the course and clubhouse.

13.3 Playing fees will be waived by clubs as games are played on a home and away basis.

13.4 The host club will provide a halfway house voucher to the value of R 100.00 for each player.

13.5 Home Clubs are requested to facilitate a short prize-giving after the game to announce results.

13.6 All Matchplay scores are required for handicapping purposes as per clause 4.6. Players must be aware of the guidelines in the HNA Handicap Manual to ensure that they correctly submit their scores.

13.7 The host club is responsible for either doing livescoring on the day or after the round manually inputting each player's hole by hole scores. Either way each player should have a score on the system which can allow the union to check that the correct score has been submitted for handicapping purposes.

13.8 Where possible, Home Clubs are to offer a cart to the visiting manager at members rates, but it is the visiting manager's responsibility to confirm and book the cart. Clubs may also agree to not charge for carts on a reciprocal basis.

13.9 No parent or spectator is allowed within 30 metres of the players. Interference by a spectator in a match will result in firstly a warning; failure to comply will result in the spectator being asked to

leave the course. It is the responsibility of the manager whose players and spectators are in question to enforce this rule.

- 13.10 Spectators are not permitted to consume alcohol whilst on the course with the players.
- 13.11 Caddies are for the players account.
- 13.12 Any club or player found to be manipulating handicaps will be subject to disciplinary sanctions by the CGGU.

**14. Disputes**

- 14.1 Should a dispute arise during or after a match regarding either a breach of a rule of golf or of a condition of the league, a claim must be made by the players according to the Rules of Golf (Rule 20.1b). If a valid claim is made the teams must resolve the dispute before the result is final. A result will be considered final once both teams have verified the scores on Scorecapture.
- 14.2 Should a situation arise that the teams are unable to resolve the dispute they should submit this in writing to the CGGU on the day that the situation arose.  
Failure to notify the union in time will result in the claim not being considered.
